Scheduling a Round of Golf

AUTOMATED TEE TIME SYSTEM

Tee times for Championship, Executive and Pitch & Putt Courses are scheduled through an automated tee time system prior to the date of play.

Golfers can make a request for a tee time 4-7 days in advance of the date of play.

WAYS TO ACCESS THE AUTOMATED TEE TIME SYSTEM

The Automated Tee Time System processes and assigns tee times between 12-1AM, and is unavailable at this time.

RESERVING OPEN TEE TIMES

Golfers can go through the tee time system 1-3 days prior to day of play to reserve open spots not assigned during the request period. Golfers can call the Golf Shop or Starter Building at the Championship, Executive and Pitch & Putt Courses on the day of play to reserve open tee times not assigned by the system.



Distribution of Tee Times

Tee times are assigned between 12-1AM, 3 days prior to the date of play, and are distributed based on points. Golfers with lower average points will be assigned tee times first.

PLACEMENT POINTS: Points based on resident and golfer status (i.e.: Championship Golf Enhancement member, The Villages resident, guest of a resident, etc.). For a group of golfers, the group's total is averaged.

RESERVATION POINTS: Points based on the number of reservations a resident has received over the last seven days. Guests are assigned the reservation history of their resident host.

Checking in For Golf Tee Times

Please arrive at the course 20 minutes prior to your scheduled tee time.

Residents must present their Resident ID card at check-in for Executive and Championship Courses.

At the Championship Courses check-in and pay any fees at the Golf Shop before proceeding to the Starter Building.

At the Executive Courses check-in and pay any fees at the Starter Building.

At Pitch & Putt Courses check-in and pay any fees at the Starter Building.

All play must start on the first hole, unless otherwise instructed by the Starter or one of the Course Ambassadors.

Please remain behind the designated point on the first tee of each course to allow the group ahead to complete the hole and clear the green.

Be sure to tell your guests to always carry their valid guest and photo ID showing their home address even when accompanied by a resident.

Pace of Play

Pace of play is one of the key factors to enjoyment of the game by all golfers. Golf courses in The Villages have been rated by the USGAs pace rating system which determines, according to length and difficulty of each hole, the acceptable time that should be allowed to play a round. This is referred to as the pace of play or the time par for each course.

Our ambassadors are on the course to help assist all golfers with maintaining an acceptable pace according to the guidelines below, ensuring all golfers have an enjoyable experience. Golfers become out of position on the course when they have a hole open AND are behind the time par for their position on the course.

CHAMPIONSHIP COURSES

The pace of play time par for the Championship Courses ranges from 4 hours and 5 minutes to 4 hours and 26 minutes.

EXECUTIVE COURSES

The pace of play time par ranges from 75 minutes to 105 minutes according to the length and difficulty of each course.

The pace of play time par is listed on each scorecard.

One of the most important factors in maintaining pace is playing the tees that are best matched with your playing ability. Not only will this help you and your group maintain pace, but you will receive far greater enjoyment from the game.

PITCH & PUTT COURSES

The pace of play "time par" ranges from 90 minutes to 125 minutes according to the length and difficulty of each course.

Course Etiquette

Avoid distracting the other players. No one should move, talk, stand close to, or directly behind the ball or the hole when a player is addressing the ball or making a stroke.

Do not step in the putting line of another player when on the green to prevent indentation in the line of the intended putt.

Place the flagstick down carefully so no damage is made to the putting green.

Remove the flagstick slowly prior to retrieving the ball, not quickly in an effort to remove the ball, and before utilizing any ball removal devices (e.g. suction cup). If you are attempting to remove the ball by hand with the flagstick still in place, please do so with caution as to not damage the edges of the cup.

Players play without delay in the interest of all golfers on the course. When the play of a hole has been completed, players should immediately leave the putting green.

Please **NEVER** play or retrieve a ball from the yard of a resident. Report any damage of private property to the homeowner.

Playing is strictly prohibited beyond the property line of our resident homes, even if not designated by white out-of-bounds stakes.

Please limit practice to designated areas. Visit one of the practice greens or golf ranges in The Villages to work on your game.

Please avoid playing more than one ball on any hole.

Please use receptacles provided for trash and do not discard cigarette butts on the course.

Leave the Course better than you found it!



Play Ready Golf

According to the USGA Rules of Golf, the player who has the honor should be allowed to play before his or her opponent or others in the group.

Ready golf is a method of play suggested, unless in competition, for speeding up play on a course.

The following suggestions will help you maintain your position on the golf course:

Be ready to play when it is your turn.

For everyone's safety on the course make sure there are no people directly in front of you.

Park golf cars behind the green on the path in the forward direction of the next tee.

Leave the green immediately upon finishing to allow the players behind to play. This includes the last hole where the tendency is to stop, total scores and exchange phone numbers.

Play at the tee markers where you can carry the full distance required to reasonably reach the green in regulation on the majority of holes.

Take extra clubs to your shots.

Drop-off the player farthest from the hole prior to reaching the green.

Playing any hole after 3 over par, please pick up the ball and proceed to the next hole.

Education on the proper protocol of golf is the most important responsibility of a golfer.

How to Dress

The following dress code is for all Championship, Executive, and Pitch & Putt Golf Courses, and The Villages Golf Academy, driving ranges, warm-up nets and putting greens.

Shoes must be worn at all times when on the golf courses. Tennis or golf shoes with soft spikes, or shoes with no more than a 1-inch heel, are mandatory.

Shorts or skirts must cover the majority of the thigh and may not be cut-off or have holes.

Denim pants are allowed.

No t-shirts, overalls, tennis skirts, cut-offs, biking shorts, bathing suits or athletic exercise apparel.

DRESS CODE FOR WOMEN

Fashion golf tops may be without a collar but should not expose the stomach and must have straps at least 2-inches wide.

DRESS CODE FOR MEN

Shirts shall have a collar and sleeves.

Turtlenecks, mock turtlenecks and blade collars are acceptable (minimum 1¼" collars).



Tee Selection

Possibly the most important factor in enjoyment of the game is selecting a tee position suitable for one's skill level. This helps par to be more attainable and assists a new or high-handicap golfer in maintaining their position on the course without undue pressure. This helps a golfer relax, produce better golf shots, and contributes to an overall positive experience for everyone on the course.

Executive Courses offer three tee placements, and Championship Courses offer up to six selections. For new golfers, we recommend starting at the most forward tee. As you improve in the game it is fun to increase your challenge by moving to the middle or back tee placement, and working your way up to a round on one of the championship courses.

The Executive Courses have been rated for difficulty on a scale of 1-4, with 1 being the friendliest and 4 being the most challenging.

Care of the Course

Golfers play a large part in determining the condition of the golf course. Proper use of golf cars in addition to good course etiquette make a big difference. Please help us keep your courses in the best shape possible by practicing Good Golf and adhering to the following suggestions:

GOLF CAR PARKING

It is important to keep all four tires on the path, especially around the tees and greens. If a golf car is parked by a tee box with two tires on the path and two on the grass, it can contribute to worn spots and ruts.

BUNKER CARE

Before leaving a bunker, a player should carefully fill up and smooth over all holes and footprints they have made.

Enter the bunker at the lowest point closest to the ball to avoid unnecessary damage to the lip.

On all courses at The Villages, we request that rakes be replaced INSIDE the bunker at 90 degrees to the edge of the bunker.

DIVOT REPAIR

Sand should be used to replace divots taken during a swing.

Complimentary sand is available at all championship and executive courses. Each golf car should have a sand bottle or container for filling divots. Depending on the course, sand will be available at the first tee or starter building.

Damage through practice swings. Players should never damage the turf during practice swings. All damage to the course during a shot should be repaired to aid speedy recovery. To maximize the use of the grass on the driving range tee, please place your ball at the grassy back edge of your previous divot, removing just a small portion of grass with each swing.

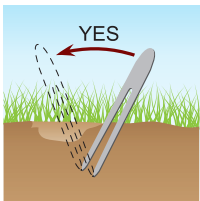
To best repair divot, do not replace the divot, but fill with a level bed of sand.

BALL MARKS

When a golf ball impacts the greens surface, in most cases, it leaves an indentation in the green referred to as a ball mark. If this ball mark is not repaired it will take up to three weeks to heal, while a properly repaired ball mark will heal in 3-4 days. While its understandable that on some occasions you may not be able to find your exact ball mark, what we suggest is that you always try and find yours and one other. Everyone will benefit from smoother putting surfaces!

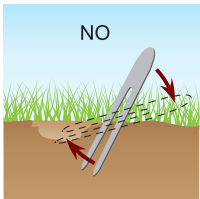
For a ball mark to heal in a timely manner it is extremely important that it is repaired properly according to the diagram below.

REPAIRING BALL MARKS PROPERLY



CORRECT WAY

1. Discard loose piece of turf.
2. Insert repair tool outside back of ball mark.
3. Pull turf toward the center of the hole.
4. Gently tap repaired area with your putter.
5. This action stretches undamaged turf over ball mark providing instant recovery.



WRONG WAY

1. Do not replace loose piece of turf. It will die and delay healing process.
2. Do not pry up center of depression with repair tool as it exposes soil and will delay recovery.
3. Do not insert repair tool and twist it. This only breaks more turf loose.



Each golf ball shown here represents a ball mark that was left un-repaired! Please care for your courses by repairing your ball marks.

Golf Car Use

The Villages has established the following guidelines and suggestions that, if followed, will minimize the stress and damage caused to the golf courses:

Golf cars must remain on the golf car paths on the executive courses with the exception of the par 4 holes. (Silver Lake is the only exception, where golf car traffic is allowed on the fairways of all holes.)

Golf cars must remain on the paths on all par 3s on the Championship Courses.

We encourage the use of the 90 degree rule on all par 4s and par 5s (see next page for explanation).

The Championship Courses have small posts, (white with green tops), named Deacon Beacons, designating where golf car traffic is restricted between the beacons and the greens. Golf cars must return to the path at or before the beacons.

A maximum of two bags and riders are allowed per golf car, regardless of the number of seats available. The only exception to this guideline is on the executive courses if the golf car remains on the golf car path at all times.

Unless special circumstances prevail, starters are not authorized to allow more than two golf cars per group.

To operate a Country-Club-owned and rented golf car, the operator must be at least 18 years of age and have a valid drivers license.

From time to time, due to wet, extremely dry, and/or other agronomic conditions, we may require golf cars to remain on paths on all or certain holes.

As we all know, golf cars have evolved not only as vehicles to use on the golf course, but as modes of transportation around our hometown. In many cases these vehicles are referred to as Low Speed Vehicles (LSVs). To be used on The Villages fairways golf cars must be under 1500 lbs curb weight, and be able to switch to turf speed while on the course.

The tires on a golf car play a significant role in how much damage and stress the use of the golf cars put onto the golf course. Since many residents use their golf cars or LSVs as modes of transportation, and have equipped them with non-traditional golf

car tires, it has become necessary to establish a tire policy in order to protect the golf courses (see below).

Spectators are permitted in golf cars, provided they observe all guidelines. A cart rental fee on the Championship Courses is required for both players and spectators.

Utility Terrain Vehicle (UTV's) Golf boards, bicycles, trikes, and motorized bicycles are prohibited on the golf courses.

TIRE POLICY

Tires on golf cars to be used on any of The Villages fairways must meet the following requirements:

1. The manufacturer of the tire must refer to the tire as a golf course tire.
2. Tires must have a rounded vertical tread with a maximum depth of 1/4 inches.
3. Total tire width must be a minimum of 8 inches.
4. Tire pressure must not exceed 28 psi.
5. Tires may change from year to year. We reserve the right to modify this policy without notice in accordance set by the tire industry.

Note: Golf cars that do not have the approved tires will not be allowed on any of the Championship Courses in The Villages. If a golfer only plays courses on the Executive Golf Trail, they will be allowed to use their golf cars, but will be restricted to paths only. All golfers with a Course Access Pass must have their tires on the approved list. Visit GolfTheVillages.com for the most updated approved list.

90 DEGREE RULE

Please keep your cart in the rough for the majority of your round. Enter the fairway only to hit a shot and then return immediately to the rough.

SINGLE RIDER GOLF CAR

If a golfer needs greater access on and around the course, such as driving onto or near the greens and tees, a "single rider golf car" must be used. Each Championship Course has single rider golf cars available for use on the Championship or Executive Courses. We recommend if you intend to rent a solo rider golf car to reserve it in advance (by calling the applicable golf shop).

Golf Car/Club Rental

Golf cars and clubs may be rented from any Country Club for use at an Executive Course.

Rental of the golf car is for golf course use only and must be returned to the Country Club upon completion of play. The daily trail fee will be applicable for guests and residents.

Silver Lake and Hill Top: Rent at Orange Blossom Hills Country Club.

De La Vista, El Diablo, and El Santiago: Rent at Tierra Del Sol Country Club.

Chula Vista and Mira Mesa: Rent at Hacienda Hills Country Club.

Saddlebrook and Hawkes Bay: Rent at Glenview Champions Country Club.

Walnut Grove, Briarwood, Amberwood, and Oakleigh: Rent at Lopez Legacy Country Club.

Churchill Greens, Belmont, and Pimlico: Rent at Palmer Legends Country Club.

Bogart and Bacall: Rent at Mallory Hill Country Club.

Heron, Pelican, Yankee Clipper, Southern Star, Bonita Pass, Redfish Run, and Tarpon Boil: Rent at Cane Garden Country Club.

Turtle Mound, Sandhill, Roosevelt, and Truman: Rent at Havana Country Club.

Palmetto, Sweetgum, and Mangrove: Rent at Evans Prairie Country Club.

Escambia, Okeechobee, Sarasota, and Volusia: Rent at Belle Glade Country Club.

Lowlands, Loblolly, Longleaf, Gray Fox, and Red Fox: Contact the Start Building, refer to page 44 and 45 for contact information.



Safety on the Course

Golf courses are restricted to golfing traffic only. Please refrain from riding, biking, fishing, walking or engaging in other recreational activities on the courses.

Pets are not permitted on golf courses or practice facilities at any time.

Please allow golfers ahead to move out of range before hitting a shot in their direction.

Play is over at dusk.

Dusk is defined as 30 minutes after sunset.

REMEMBER THE 1, 2, 3 APPROACH FOR ANY GOLF COURSE EMERGENCY

If you ever experience any health emergency on the golf course, please follow these 3 steps:

1. **Call 911 and give your exact location.** (Example: Fox Run Hole #6 Green; Bonita Pass Hole #3 Tee Box)
2. **Notify golf staff** Call the golf shop or Executive starter building. (Phone number on the score card)
3. **Stay where you are.** EMS will be coming to your exact location.

LIGHTNING SAFETY

Seek shelter immediately at the first sign of lightning.

Courses do not close due to lightning, nor will our staff ask you to leave the course. Although we do recommend you leave the course if you witness lightning, if you choose to continue, please proceed at your own risk. Rain checks will be distributed if applicable.

Covered golf cars do not provide appropriate safety protection from lightning.

Do not seek shelter under trees and power lines.

BE AWARE:

The United States Golf Association (USGA) emphasizes the right of players to stop play if they think lightning threatens them, even though the committee or staff has not asked players to stop play.

Weather Delays

FROST DELAYS

In the event of frost, the golf course will be closed until such time that play will not damage the grass as determined by the golf course superintendent.

FOG DELAYS

In the event of heavy fog, the golf course will be closed until the golf course team determines play can safely start from the first tee.

All tee times prior to opening time will be forfeited.

The golf course staff will make every effort to accommodate all players in an effort that will not cause later tee times to be affected.

This may not be possible in all instances.

If your tee time is cancelled and you are unable to be accommodated or forward started, you will not be assessed a reservation point.



Course Access Pass (CAP) Policy

Course Access Pass cards will be issued only to those individuals who have a state certified disabled parking permit. A valid handicap placard, along with a drivers license and registration will need to be presented to the Golf Administration offices to obtain or renew a CAP Card. Expiration date of the handicap placard will be the expiration date on the CAP Card. CAP tags must be prominently displayed on your golf car while playing any of The Villages golf courses.

CAP TAGS MAY BE OBTAINED IN ONE OF TWO WAYS:

1. An "annual" CAP tag is available for purchase at any Country Club golf shop and at the Golf Administration office. These annual CAP tags are valid for the calendar year in which it was purchased or until the accompanying CAP card expires.
2. "Daily" CAP tags are available at both Country Club and Executive Golf Course starter buildings at no charge. These Daily use tags are only available to golfers holding a valid CAP card. The starter will hold the CAP card until the CAP tag is returned following the completion of the round.

USE OF COURSE ACCESS PASS GUIDELINES

Applies only to the individual(s) with the CAP card. Parking of golf cars on the slopes/surrounds of any green is prohibited.

Golf cars must be kept a minimum of 10 yards from Greens.

Do not park in front of Greens.

Avoid areas between the green and bunkers.

When conditions warrant and the course has been designated Cart Path Only, *ALL* golfers including those with CAP cards must adhere to the cart path only restrictions.

Guest Play

As active residents of The Villages you will undoubtedly have guests visit you from time to time. We want you to be well informed of the guidelines for you and your guest to get your round off to a good start!

Guests whose home address is outside of Lake, Sumter, and Marion counties are eligible to use select amenity-supported recreation facilities; which includes the Executive Golf Courses. Fees will apply.

A Guest ID Card is required for guests 1 year of age or older. Guest passes can be obtained at your service locations or the District Customer Service Office. For more information with these locations, visit DistrictGov.org.

Be sure to tell your guest to always carry their valid photo ID along with their Guest ID Card.

If your child or grandchild resides in Lake, Marion, or Sumter County, you may obtain an In Area Guest ID Card for them at your service locations or the District Customer Service Office. Residents must accompany these child(ren) or grandchild(ren) to all recreation centers and the executive golf courses.

Children under the age of 10 wishing to play golf must see one of the team professionals at a Championship Course for a proficiency approval before playing.

Spectators under the age of 10 are not permitted.

CHAMPIONSHIP COURSES

Children 16 and older are allowed to play unaccompanied provided they have the appropriate guest pass.

If your guest does not qualify for a guest pass for The Villages they will pay the non-resident greens fee.

EXECUTIVE AND PITCH & PUTT COURSES

Guests under the age of 19 must be accompanied by a resident of The Villages or a guest of The Villages, 19 or over, with a valid guest and photo ID.

HITTING NETS

All Country Club facilities without a driving range feature hitting nets for warm-up. To be courteous to other players, we ask you to please limit your warm-up to 20 balls or less.

PUTTING GREENS

Practice putting greens are available at all country clubs and most executive courses. Golf shots (chip shots) knee high or lower are allowed as long as they do not cause damage to the green or are potentially causing harm to others. Some courses have two greens; one designated for putting and one designated for pitching. Please follow the appropriate signage.

Championship Golf & Country Clubs

Sorted by distance



TIERRA DEL SOL COUNTRY CLUB

One of the most challenging 18 holes in The Villages, this course plays to over 6800 yards. The front 9 is long and well-bunkered with very few trees. The back 9 was designed to preserve the natural beauty and wildlife of the nature preserves that come into play on eight holes. Four sets of tees make this course playable and enjoyable for all skill levels. Facilities include chipping and putting greens, pro shop, restaurant, tennis courts and a hitting net for warming up.



HACIENDA HILLS GOLF CLUB

This 27-hole course is a great test for all skill levels. Though bunkers come into play on every hole and water on eight holes, there are very few forced carries. Hole 1 on The Lakes and The Oaks share one large green and are mirror image par 5s with a lake between the fairways.



ORANGE BLOSSOM HILLS COUNTRY CLUB

This 18-hole, par 72 course plays the shortest of the championship courses. Water comes into play on 3 holes, and 16 holes have bunkers. There is only one forced carry over water. Holes 6, 11, 12 and 13 weave through a stand of large oak trees. Facilities include a golf shop, putting and chipping greens, a hitting net for warming up, restaurant, pool, tiki bar and hot tub.



GLENVIEW CHAMPIONS COUNTRY CLUB

At Glenview Champions, changes in elevation challenge players with uphill, downhill and sidehill lies placing a premium on shot placement and putting skill. The par 3s are some of the most challenging in Central Florida. 6 sets of tees make this course playable for all skill levels. Tee Time System Terminology

REQUEST: A request for a tee time is made 4-7 days in advance of the day you wish to play. After the tee times are assigned, between midnight and 1:00AM three days prior, you must check back with the system to see if your request was assigned a tee time. There is no guarantee a request will be assigned a reservation.

RESERVATION: This is a confirmed tee time. Reservations are obtained from making a request in the system or from obtaining an open tee time. Time over course/course over time: This is a feature of the system that tells the system how to look for a tee time for your group when you've made a request, based on your preference. According to your selection, you are telling the system that either the course you play is most important to you, or the time is most important. For example, if you request a tee time on five courses between 7:00 and 9:00 with 8:00 being your preferred time, and you choose "course over time," it will begin searching all tee times on the course you select first before moving on to the next course. In the same scenario if you selected "time over course," the system would search for an 8:00 tee time at each of the five courses and begin working its way outwards from 8:00 until it locates a tee time within your time window.

TIME WINDOW: The time frame in which you tell the system you'd like to play. For example; you may select 7:28 as the earliest time you'd like to play and 9:28 as the latest time. This would give you a time window of 2 hours from 7:28-9:28. The larger the window the more tee times the system will look at for available tee times.

PREFERRED TIME: In addition to the time window, the system allows you to select the preferred time you wish to play. If the system

cannot accommodate your preferred time, it will begin working its way outward from that tee time. If your time window is from 7:28-9:28, with a preferred time of 9:00, the system will start looking at the time before and the time after 9:00 and work its way outwards until it reaches the earliest and latest times in your window.

Open tee time: Tee times that have not been reserved when tee times were assigned by the system. These tee times are available to all residents to claim via the reservation option of the tee time system. Placement points and reservation points have no bearing on obtaining open tee times.

GROUPS: Two or more foursomes. The system can accept up to 8 foursomes in a group (32 players).

GROUP DAYS: Days in which tee times are assigned on the Championship Courses to group of 8-32 players before individual foursomes.

WAVE: The method we use to schedule available tee times on the Championship Golf Courses the vast majority of the time. Waves refer to the time tee times are available. The "morning wave" begins at 7:28 and ends at 9:28. The "afternoon wave" begins at 11:56 and ends at 1:56. There are no tee times between the waves or after the "afternoon wave." Therefore, if you request a tee time between 9:30 and 11:50, you'll never receive a tee time. Waves are sometimes referred to as "double tee starts" or "cross-overs" at other golf courses outside The Villages.

STRAIGHT TIMES: This method of starting times is what is used on the Executive Golf Courses and on the 18 hole Championship Courses. This is simply tee times that start early in the morning and run consecutively the entire day until around 90 minutes before dusk on the Executive Courses.

SHOTGUN: A method where all players start at once on various holes throughout the course. This is used sparingly and primarily for tournaments.

Schedule for Requesting Tee Times

A request can be made up to seven (7) days in advance. The following is a schedule for making a request based on the day you want to play.

To play Sunday: You may request from the prior Sunday until midnight Wednesday.

To play Monday: You may request from the prior Monday until midnight Thursday.

To play Tuesday: You may request from the prior Tuesday until midnight Friday.

To play Wednesday: You may request from the prior Wednesday until midnight Saturday

To play Thursday: You may request from the prior Thursday until midnight Sunday.

To play Friday: You may request from the prior Friday until midnight Monday.

To play Saturday: You may request from the prior Saturday until midnight Tuesday.
